1.5 Project Description

The Ministry of Energy (MoE) is undertaking the Coal-Fired Power Plant in Lamu, Kenya.

The project involves the construction of a 900–1,000MW coal-fired power plant. It includes the construction of a powerhouse and substations, the installation of transformers and generators and the laying of transmission lines and related infrastructure.

In September 2013, MoE issued expression of interest (EOI) from the companies to develop the project on build, own and operate (BOO) basis with October 25, 2013 as the EOI documents submission deadline.

In November 2013, 26 companies submitted EOI proposals for the project. Successful investor will build, own and operate the plant, with an option to transfer to the government after recovering full value of investment.

MoE is currently in the process of short listing bidders to participate in the request for proposal (RFP) for the project.

1.6 Project Background

The Coal-Fired Power Plant project is being planned to be developed in Lamu.

The project is part of the government's plan to add 5,000MW to Kenya's power output by 2017.

The purpose of the project is to enhance electricity generation capacity to meet the growing demand of power supply.

1.7 Latest Update

February 2014 – Tender process is underway for the project.

November 21, 2013 – 26 companies submitted their EOI proposals for the project.

September 28, 2013 – MoE issued EOI for the project.

Q3 2013 – MoE announced plans to develop the gas-fired power plant project.
